Byward Market's newest bistro opens doors with charity fundraiser

Ottawa, Canada – July 21, 2003 LUXE Bistro – Ottawa's newest hot spot for great food and better drinks – celebrates with "French Twist" a social and fundraiser for the Ottawa Hospital Foundation.

Operating from one of the Byward Market's best locations at the corner of York and Clarence, LUXE Bistro introduces a new level of dining to Ottawa that owner Bob Firestone describes as "casual-chic". Firestone also operates the nearby Blue Cactus Bar and Grill. While the Cactus specializes in southwestern sizzle, LUXE is motivated by a big-city American feel and straight-up bistro style. LUXE takes a step back to a time when lunch and dinner were simple and quality high.

Head Chef Derek Benitz and his team deliver Mediterranean and French influenced fare in an environment designed for people who love great dining without pretence. Guests at LUXE Bistro enjoy a meal prepared by a team of experienced professionals who are passionate about food.

Inside the bistro, comfy leather seats, a gentle colour palette, and the dark sheen of hardwood lure guests into a classic steak house with a contemporary flair reflected by soft light and glass. In the relaxed environment with excellent conversation lines patrons linger for hours in intimate rounded booths, at the tempting martini bar, or on the patio surrounded by the vitality of the Market.

Despite having had just four weeks to perfect the LUXE experience leading up to today's event, the bistro staff has already developed some regulars. "We've only been in business a month but I've noticed repeat customers and that's really encouraging to me," says Bob Firestone. "Our attitude is that every guest coming through the door has to have the best possible experience from service to food to drink and back again."

LUXE Bistro makes a point of giving back to the community that keeps it in business: while guests invited to "French Twist" will enjoy complimentary hors doueveres and cocktails, each will contribute \$20 to the Ottawa Hospital Foundation's Emergency Expansion Project.

The renovation and expansion project of the Emergency Department at the Civic Campus of The Ottawa Hospital will double the capacity of the Emergency Services area. The last major renovation was in 1975 and the current configuration was built to handle 40,000 patients per year. The Emergency Department will double in size to accommodate the current patient volume

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of 55,000 per year to the planned volume of 75,000 patients. This expansion will provide The Ottawa Hospital with an environment that is focused on the needs of the patients providing them with increased privacy, space and comfort.

"Business support through events like this is an important part of the Ottawa Hospital Foundation Legacy Campaign," said Susan Doyle, President and CEO of The Ottawa Hospital Foundation. "We wish everyone at LUXE Bistro the best of luck and appreciate their contribution to improving healthcare and our Hospital."

Like Blue Cactus, LUXE Bistro is a family affair. In addition to dreaming up the original LUXE concept, Bob's brother Sam helped secure the location through his commercial real estate operation while Sam's wife Susan is responsible for the attractive, upscale decor. Two other Firestone siblings, Phil and Ida, remain as partners in the business. Judging by the continued popularity of The Blue Cactus and the positive response to LUXE's arrival, the Firestone Family has a unique recipe for culinary success in the Byward Market.
